

2022 British Business Awards Education Partnership Award Application



Education Partnership Award overview

The Education Partnership Award will be presented to a UK higher or further education institution that has partnered with a Chinese organisation to deliver significant impact. This Award recognises UK HE or FE education institutions that are actively engaged with China, their contribution to UK-China collaboration and to raise awareness of their success in doing so among audiences in both the UK and China.

Judges will be looking for evidence of:

- A partnership that has had a significant impact and exceptional performance in multiple areas, including teaching, graduate employability, student experience and others
- A partnership that has led to other projects or initiatives
- A collaboration that has enhanced the UK institution's international profile and contributed to the Chinese partner's internationalisation
- Partnership that have made a significant contribution to local and regional development in the UK and China

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Judging Process

- A panel of 5 judges will individually score each application.
- Judges will give an overall score for the whole application.
- The score will be tallied and a shortlist of three finalists will be drawn up.
- The same judges will then come together as a group and discuss the merits of each of the finalists, coming to a clear decision on the winner.
- In the case of a split decision, judges will be asked to rank the finalists and the winner will be calculated.
- The winners of each award will be revealed on the night.

Application Process

- Applications must be uploaded before **1 July, 2022**
- Applications may not run over the word limits set for each section.
